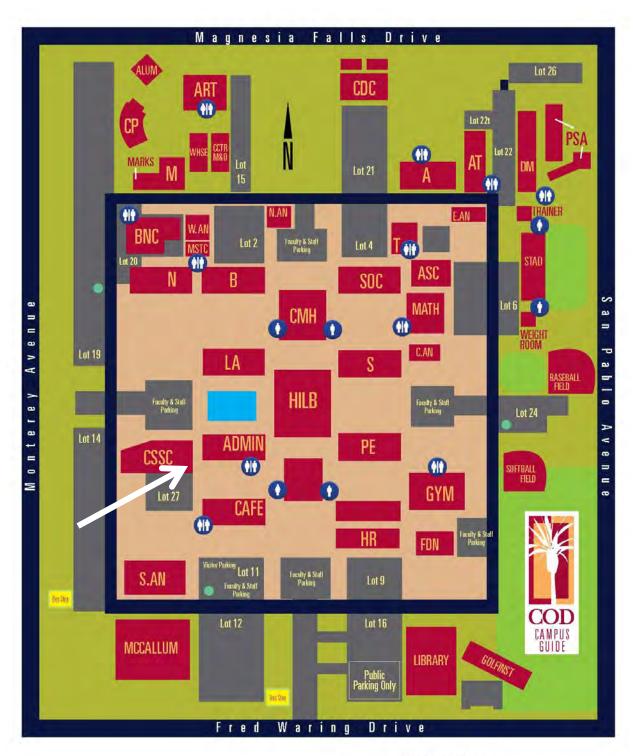

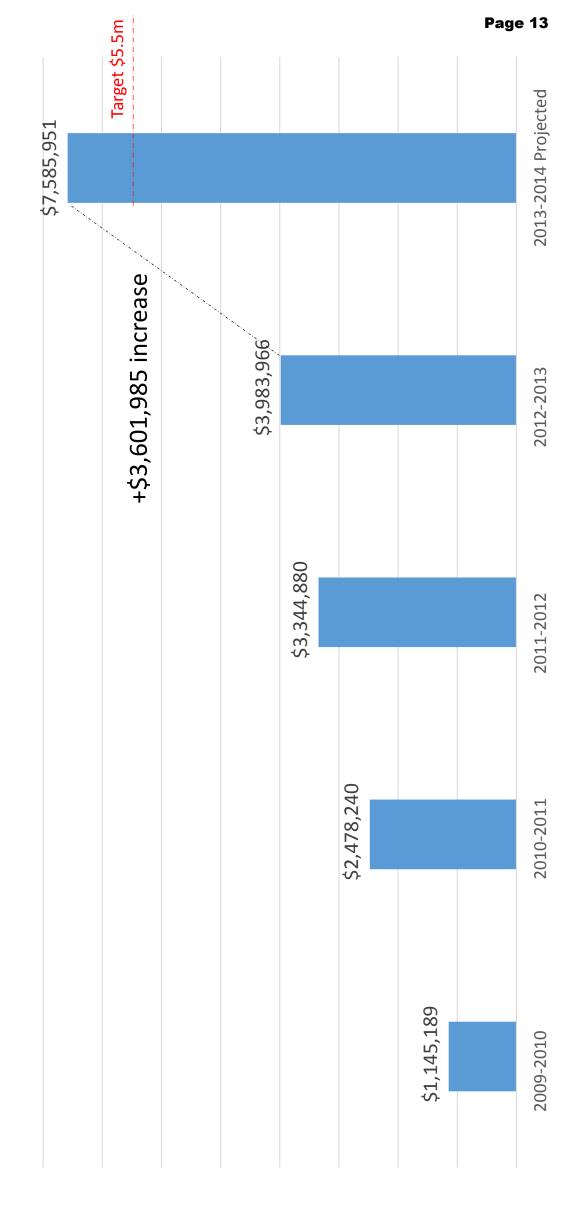

Proposed 2014-2015 Operating Budget

The budget was handed out and discussed. A few errors were found and Jim Hummer will be sending the corrected one via email tomorrow.

It was M/S/C Bob Archer/Brian Holcombe to present the budget for adoption at next board meeting as distributed.

Financials

The April 2014 financials were reviewed and discussed. It was suggested that too much minutia was discussed in the Board meetings. Although the Board of Directors needs all the information it is hoped that the Finance committee can review the financials at their monthly meetings and give a proper overview of any discrepancies that they feel should be outlined to the full board. Perhaps a minimum variance level could be used such as \$5,000.

IPS

Jim Hummer and Suz will meet this summer to go over possible Capital Campaign addendum revisions to the IPS.

Benchmarks and Fees

Suz wants to meet with the investors individually to discuss benchmarks and fees. Kippy will set up meetings. The possibility of having a Custodian to oversee the FDN investments was discussed as a potential avenue to save on fees. Brian Holcombe will do research this summer on a retro analysis of the last 5 years. Committee also discussed Exchange Traded Funds (ETFs) Bob Archer will speak with Jim Hamm and David Wilson (McCallum) and set up a meeting with Suz to get more information about these funds.

Capital Needs Analysis

Jim reported that he has not received spending priorities from the College yet.
